

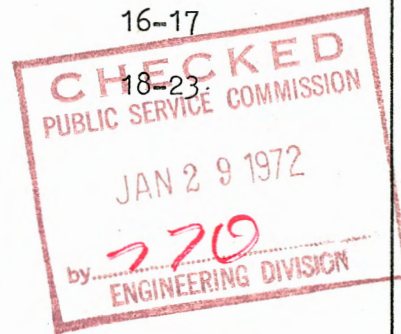

Available for general service to residential, commercial and industrial customers, subject to the limitations and restrictions set forth on Tariff Sheets Nos. 14 and 15.

Rate:

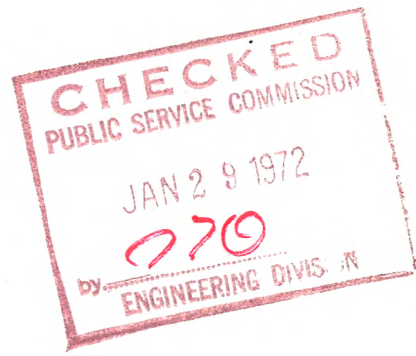

General Gas Rate - Large Volume Space Heating

Applicable:

In all territory served.

Availability (Limited):

Available for general service to commercial and industrial customers who, by reason of large heating loads are not eligible for service under the terms of General Gas Rate G-1, subject to the limitations and restrictions set forth on Tariff Sheets Nos. 14 and 15.

Conditions of Service:

All gas supplied at any location hereunder will be delivered through one point, except where Company's operating convenience requires delivery at two or more points. Air conditioning service will be supplied hereunder in accordance with the rider applicable to such service.

Rate:

First 20,000 cu ft or less per month.....\$13.80 net
Excess over 20,000 cu ft per month.....6.0¢ net per 100 cu ft

Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause:

The monthly amount computed at the charges specified above shall be increased or decreased in accordance with the Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause set forth on Tariff Sheet No. 13.

Minimum Bill:

The monthly bill shall not be less than 20% of the customer's highest monthly bill rendered for the preceding January, February, or March billing period, nor less than \$13.80 plus purchased gas adjustment.

Prompt Payment Provision:

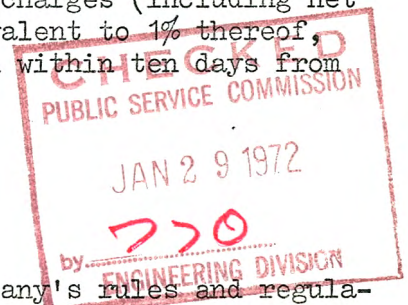

**STANDARD RIDER**

**Summer Air Conditioning Service Under Gas Rates G-1 and G-1A**

**Applicable:**

To General Gas Rates G-1 and G-1A.

**Availability:**

Available to any customer who takes gas service under Rate G-1 or Rate G-1A and who has installed and in regular operation a gas burning summer air conditioning system with a cooling capacity of three tons or more. The special rate set forth herein shall be applicable during the five monthly billing periods of each year beginning with the period covered by the regular June meter reading and ending with the period covered by the regular October meter reading.

**Rate:**

For "Summer Air Conditioning Consumption" determined in the manner herein-after prescribed, the rate shall be 3.5 cents net per 100 cubic feet, subject to the "Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause" and to the "Prompt Payment Provision" incorporated in Rate G-1 or Rate G-1A, as applicable. All monthly consumption other than "Summer Air Conditioning Consumption" shall be billed at the regular charges set forth in Rate G-1 or Rate G-1A, beginning with the initial block of such schedule.

**Determination of Summer Air Conditioning Consumption:**

The Summer Air Conditioning Consumption shall be determined as follows:

**Residential Service:**

For each of the aforesaid five billing periods all gas consumption in excess of 5,000 cubic feet per single family dwelling unit shall be taken as the Summer Air Conditioning Consumption.

**Commercial and Industrial Service:**

(1) Where the only gas usage during the aforesaid five billing periods is considered to be for summer air conditioning purposes (this being the case when gas is used only for summer air conditioning or only for space heating and summer air conditioning), the consumption recorded on the regular meter during such five periods shall all be taken as the Summer Air Conditioning Consumption.

(2) Where gas is used during the aforesaid five billing periods for purposes other than space heating and summer air conditioning and where summer air conditioning usage during such periods can be isolated from such other gas usage in such a way as to permit separate metering of summer air conditioning usage, the Summer Air Conditioning Consumption will be determined by separate metering. During the seven remaining billing periods the readings of such separate meter will be combined

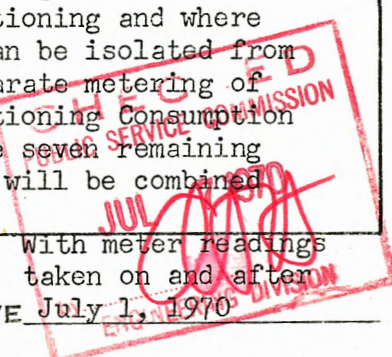

Interruptible Commercial and Industrial Gas Rate

Applicable:

In all territory served.

Availability (Limited):

Available for interruptible gas service to commercial and industrial customers who can be adequately served from the Company's existing distribution system, subject to the limitations and restrictions set forth on Tariff Sheets Nos. 14 and 15. No customer whose gas usage is of such nature that it cannot be curtailed or completely interrupted without adversely affecting the public welfare, health or safety shall be eligible for service hereunder unless he is equipped with adequate standby fuel facilities acceptable to Company.

Next	350,000 cu ft per month.....	5.6¢ net per 100 cu ft

Prompt Payment Provision:

The monthly bill will be rendered at the above net charges (including net minimum bills when applicable) plus an amount equivalent to 1% thereof, which amount will be deducted provided bill is paid within ten days from date.

Interruptibility:

Company shall have the right to discontinue the supply of gas hereunder wholly or in part for such period or periods as, in the judgment of the Company, may be necessary to enable it to supply the full gas requirements of its customers served on a firm basis.

Applicability of Rules:

Service under this rate schedule is subject to Company's rules and regulations governing the supply of gas service as incorporated in this Tariff.

Seasonal Off-Peak Gas Rate

Applicable:

In all territory served.

Availability (Limited):

Available during the 275-day period from March 15 to December 15 of each year to commercial and industrial customers using over 50,000 cubic feet of gas per day who can be adequately served from the Company's existing distribution system without impairment of service to other customers and who agree to the complete discontinuance of gas service for equipment served hereunder and the substitution of other fuels during the 3-month period from December 15 to March 15. No gas service whatsoever to utilization equipment served hereunder will be supplied or permitted to be taken under any other of the Company's gas rate schedules during such 3-month period. Any gas utilization equipment on customer's premises of such nature or used for such purposes that gas service thereto cannot be completely discontinued during the period from December 15 to March 15 will not be eligible for service under this rate, and gas service thereto must be segregated from service furnished hereunder and supplied through a separate meter at the Company's applicable standard rate for year-around service. This rate shall not be available for loads which are predominantly space heating in character or which do not consume substantial quantities of gas during the summer months.

Availability of service under this schedule is subject to the limitations and restrictions set forth on Tariff Sheets Nos. 14 and 15.

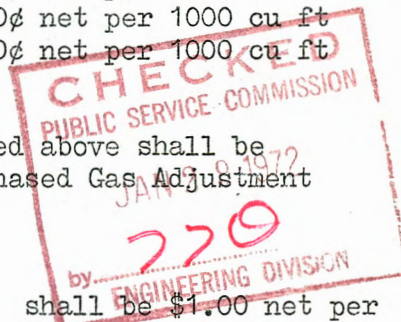

Dual-Fuel Off-Peak Gas Space Heating Rate

Applicable:

In all territory served.

Availability (Limited):

Available on an off-peak basis to a commercial or industrial customer for interruptible gas service to space heating equipment with a rated input capacity in excess of 1,000,000 Btu per hour, who can be adequately served from the Company's existing distribution system without impairment of service to other customers, and who contracts for service subject to the special conditions hereinafter set forth.

Availability of service under this schedule is subject to the limitations and restrictions set forth on Tariff Sheets Nos. 14 and 15.

Rate:

55¢ net per 1,000 cubic feet.

Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause:

The monthly amount computed at the charges specified above shall be increased or decreased in accordance with the Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause set forth on Tariff Sheet No. 13.

Prompt Payment Provision:

The monthly bill will be rendered at the above net charges plus an amount equivalent to 1% thereof, which amount will be deducted provided bill is paid within ten days from date.

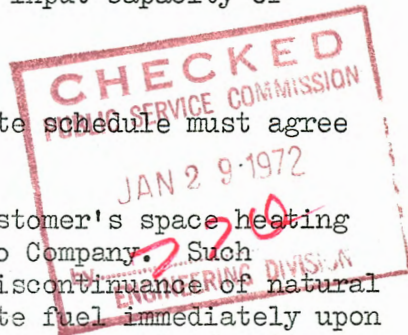
Minimum Annual Charge:

Service supplied hereunder shall be subject to a minimum annual revenue guarantee of 25¢ net per 1,000 Btu of rated hourly input capacity of customer's space heating equipment.

Special Conditions:

Any customer contracting for service under this rate schedule must agree in writing to the following special conditions:

1. The design, type and manner of operation of Customer's space heating installation served hereunder must be acceptable to Company. Such installation must be designed to permit complete discontinuance of natural gas usage and substitution of oil or other alternate fuel immediately upon notice from Company to Customer directing such discontinuance of natural gas usage.

Summer Air Conditioning Service Under Gas Rate G-8

Applicable:

To Dual-Fuel Off-Peak Gas Space Heating Rate G-8.

Availability:

Available to any customer who takes gas space heating service under Rate G-8 and who installs and operates a gas burning summer air conditioning system in accordance with the terms of this rider. The special rate set forth herein shall be applicable during the five monthly billing periods of each year beginning with the period covered by the regular June meter reading and ending with the period covered by the regular October meter reading.

Rate:

For consumption recorded during the aforesaid five billing periods the rate shall be 35 cents net per 1000 cubic feet, subject to the "Purchased Gas Adjustment Clause" and to the "Prompt Payment Provision" incorporated in Rate G-8.

Minimum Bill:

Application of this rider shall not alter the regular Minimum Annual Charge provision of Rate G-8.

Other Terms and Conditions:

Gas service under this rider is applicable only to summer air conditioning usage in conjunction with space heating service supplied under a Rate G-8 contract. This rider will not be applicable if gas is used for purposes other than space heating and summer air conditioning; provided, however, that when gas service is purchased under Rate G-8 for a steam boiler or other gas burning facility utilized jointly for space heating, summer air conditioning, and incidental water heating (where water heating usage during the five months availability of this special rate is not more than 25% of air conditioning usage), the special rate set forth herein shall apply to all gas usage under the Rate G-8 contract during the five monthly billing periods above designated.

Gas Rate Adjustment on Account of Changes in Cost of Purchased Gas

Applicable to: Gas rate schedules G-1, G-1A, G-2, G-6 and G-8

Purchased Gas Adjustment:

To each bill rendered under the above-named rate schedules (except minimum bills under Rates G-6 and G-8) there shall be added an amount, computed at the following rate:

1.375¢ per 100 cubic feet of gas used during the period covered by bill.



Conformed Excerpt from the Public Service Commission's Order Dated November 26, 1957, in Case No. 3300

The rates authorized herein (Case No. 3300—November 26, 1957) are based upon the wholesale cost of gas to the Applicant (Louisville Gas and Electric Company) as computed upon rates of its wholesale suppliers then currently in effect under Federal Power Commission tariffs for interstate business or under wholesale tariffs of this Commission. For the purpose of this purchased gas adjustment clause, these rates shall be considered as the base rate for purchased gas. In the event there is any change in this base rate, either increase or decrease, the Applicant (Louisville Gas and Electric Company) shall within thirty days from the time it receives notice of the proposed change file with this Commission the following information:

- (1) A copy of the Federal Power Commission tariff effecting the change in the base rates and a statement relative to the effective date of such proposed change.
- (2) A statement setting out the details of gas purchased under the provisions of the base rate for the previous twelve months showing billing under the base rate and under the proposed revised rate applicable to this service.
- (3) A balance sheet as of the end of the twelve months period and a statement of operating expenses and revenues in the same detail as reported to this Commission in the Utility's Annual Report.
- (4) A forecast showing the estimated gas purchases from all of the Utility's contract suppliers for the next twelve months period together with an estimate of the cost thereof.
- (5) Such other information as this Commission may request for a proper determination of the purchased gas adjustment.

Upon receipt of this information this Commission will review the effect of the revised base rate on the operations of the Applicant (Louisville Gas and Electric Company) and will prior to the effective date of the revised base rate, but not less than thirty days from date of the filing of the above prescribed information, issue its Order setting out the purchased gas adjustment that the utility shall apply to its rates and/or such refunds as may be proper.

The maximum amount of the adjustment so prescribed shall not produce revenue adjustments based upon the actual preceding twelve months period, greater than the difference between the purchased gas billed at the then existing rate and the purchased gas billed at the revised rate.

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SUPPLY OF GAS SERVICE

Rules Governing Application of Gas Rate Schedules  
 (Including Limitations and Restrictions Thereon)

All gas service supplied by the Company under its five standard rate schedules shall be subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

The present general shortage of natural gas and the inability of Company's supplier of natural gas to make commitments for increased deliveries in the future require that the Company undertake measures to protect gas users and the general public against the connection to Company's mains of a larger volume of gas load than can be adequately and safely served within the limits of Company's present and prospective gas supply. Accordingly, on and after February 15, 1972, the following rules and limitations shall apply to all gas service supplied by Company.

1. General Gas Rate G-1. Rate G-1 will continue to be available for residential and commercial (including public agency) uses of gas; however, the total rated input capacity of new or additional gas space heating load eligible for service under Rate G-1 shall be limited to 1,000,000 Btu per hour for any new or existing customer at any one location. Provided, however, that a new apartment or similar building designed for residential occupancy shall be eligible for an input capacity of up to 2,000,000 Btu per hour.

No new or additional industrial gas load may be connected for service under Rate G-1 by any new or existing customer.

2. General Gas Rate G-1A (Large Volume Space Heating). Service under Rate G-1A is limited to those customers and locations which were being served thereunder on June 30, 1971. On and after February 15, 1972, no customer shall be eligible for any increase in his connected gas load under Rate G-1A.

3. Interruptible Commercial and Industrial Gas Rate G-2. Service under Rate G-2 shall be limited to those customers and locations being served thereunder on February 14, 1972. On and after February 15, 1972, no customer shall be eligible for any increase in his connected gas load under Rate G-2.

4. Seasonal Off-Peak Gas Rate G-6. The Company will not accept any new contract under Rate G-6 for the supply of more than 500,000 cubic feet of gas on any one day nor more than 12,500,000 cubic feet in any one month, nor will it permit the connection under an existing contract of additional loads, either singly or in the aggregate, of greater magnitude than that specified herein.

5. Dual-Fuel Off-Peak Gas Space Heating Rate G-8. The total rated input capacity of new or additional gas space heating load eligible for service under:

Rules Governing Application of Gas Rate Schedules (Continued)
(Including Limitations and Restrictions Thereon)

Rate G-8 shall be limited to 5,000,000 Btu per hour for any new or existing customer at any one location. The customer must demonstrate to Company's satisfaction that any new or additional space heating equipment connected for service under Rate G-8 can and will be switched over to alternate fuel within not more than four hours from the time of notification by Company to discontinue the use of gas.

6. Extensions of Facilities and Notice of Requirements. The connection of any new or additional commercial and industrial gas load is contingent upon the existence of sufficient capacity in Company's gas system at the point of service or Company's ability to extend its system in accordance with its main extension rules and policies. Such connection is also contingent upon sufficient notice being given to enable Company to determine the availability of the quantity of gas required to serve the load.

7. Curtailment and Interruption of Service. Company's standard rate schedules G-2, G-6 and G-8 are available only for interruptible gas service, and Company shall have the right to require curtailment or interruption of gas usage under such rate schedules in accordance with the terms thereof. The order of such curtailment or interruption, insofar as practicable, shall be as follows:

- Step 1. Deliveries under Seasonal Off-Peak Gas Rate G-6.
Step 2. Deliveries under Dual-Fuel Off-Peak Gas Space Heating Rate G-8.
Step 3. Deliveries under Interruptible Commercial and Industrial Gas Rate G-2.

If, after reasonable notice from Company, any customer served under any of the above-named interruptible rate schedules fails to limit his use of gas as directed by Company, then Company shall have the right, at its option, to discontinue its entire supply of gas to such customer and to withhold such supply until satisfactory assurance is given by the customer that any and all subsequent requests for limitation of his gas usage will be fully complied with.

If withdrawal of service under interruptible rate schedules fails to relieve an emergency shortage of gas, the Company shall have the right to direct industrial customers under Rates G-1 and G-1A to limit their use of gas to the amount necessary to prevent damage to their equipment.

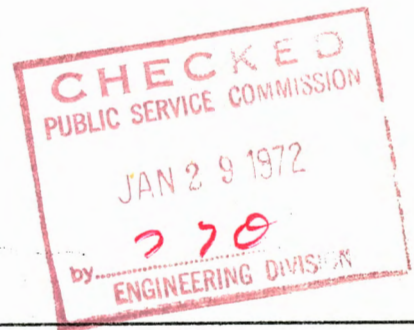

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SUPPLY OF GAS SERVICE

Gas Main Extension Rules

1. The Company will extend its gas mains at its own expense for a distance of one hundred feet to each bona-fide applicant for year-round gas service who agrees in writing to take service when the extension is completed and who has installed and ready for connection one or more major gas appliances, such as a range, water heater, central heating system, or a central gas-fired air conditioning system.
2. The Company will extend its gas mains in excess of the above distance provided the applicant for service advances to the Company an amount equal to the estimated cost of such excess portion of the extension.
3. The Company will extend its gas mains to serve a proposed real estate subdivision provided the applicant for such extension advances to the Company an amount equal to the estimated cost of the total extension.
4. The Company will install at its own expense a service pipe of suitable capacity extending from its gas main to the customer's property line beyond which point all necessary piping shall be installed by and at the expense of the customer and in a manner acceptable to the Company.
5. The Company will install at its own expense the necessary meter together with the regulator required to convert from medium pressure to service pressure. Where it is necessary to tap a high pressure gas line to serve an ultimate customer or a group of such customers in accordance with Company's rules, practice or contractual obligation, the Company will make such high pressure connection and install the required additional high pressure regulator, the estimated cost of such connection and regulator to be paid by the customer or customers to be served.
6. For each new year-round customer actually connected to the extension within a ten-year period following completion thereof, but not to extensions or laterals therefrom, the Company will refund to each applicant who advanced funds in accordance with Paragraph 2 or 3 above an amount equal to 100 times the average unit cost per foot of extension advanced by such applicant; provided that such refunds shall not exceed, in the aggregate, the amount originally advanced to the Company.
7. In the event the Company is required to make a further extension of its mains to serve a customer, Company reserves the right to discontinue extension constructed under these rules and to make connections from such additional extensions without application of the refund referred to in Paragraph 6 above.

Gas Main Extension Rules (Continued)

8. The title to all extensions herein provided for, together with all necessary rights-of-way, permits and easements, shall be and remain in the Company.

9. The above rules apply to applicants for residential or small commercial gas service. Nothing herein shall be construed as preventing Company from making at its own expense greater extensions than herein prescribed for large commercial or industrial loads provided the potential consumption and revenue is of such amount and permanency as to warrant and render economically feasible the capital expenditure involved.

10. The Company shall not be obligated to extend its gas mains in cases where such extensions, in the judgment of Company would be infeasible, impractical, or contrary to good operating practice.

24. Temporary and Short Term Service. The customer shall pay the cost of all material, labor and expense incurred by the Company in supplying gas service for any temporary or short term use, in addition to the regular rates for service without pro-rating of rate blocks or minimum bills for service of less than thirty days in a regular meter reading period.

25. Charges for Disconnecting and Reconnecting Service. Customers desiring temporary suspension of service will be charged an amount to cover the cost of disconnecting and reconnecting the service before the service is reconnected.

A reconnection charge of one dollar will be made and collected by the Company before service is restored after having been discontinued for non-payment of bills or for violation of the Company's rules and regulations.

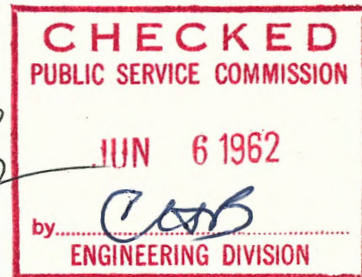

26. Choice of Optional Rates. When two or more rate schedules are available for the same class of service and the customer is undecided as to which schedule will result in the lowest annual cost, the Company will assist the customer in the choice of the most favorable schedule, the customer then to designate the schedule he desires. In those cases in which decision as to the most favorable schedule is difficult of pre-determination the customer will be given reasonable opportunity to change to another schedule after trial of the schedule originally designated; provided, however, that, after the first such change, the Company may not be required to make a change in schedule more often than once in twelve months.

While the Company will endeavor to assist customers in the choice of the most advantageous schedule, it does not guarantee that customers will at all times be served under the most favorable rate, nor will the Company make refunds representing the difference in charges between the rate under which service has actually been billed and another rate applicable to the same class of service.
